From the Pastor's Office



Summer book club is in full swing and it is always a great time to gather with others to discuss the materials we have read together. Our book for June was The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store and I think I speak for our whole group when I say that this book was difficult to get through. However, although one of our participants would go as far as to say this book was "awful", we also agreed that delightful and heartful discussion came from the topics and characters in this book. That's the beautiful thing about reading together: even if you don't enjoy the book as a whole, you still get something out of it.

The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store tells of a mixed culture community in the early 1900s and the diverse and difficult lives they live. Ultimately, the characters, despite their differences, come together as a community, united by a common goal.

"To her the world was not a china closet where you admire this and don't touch that. Rather she saw it as a place where every act of living was chance for a *tikkun olam*, to improve the world." (page 275)

Tikkun olam was not a phrase I was familiar with before this story. I appreciated this description of tikkun olam on Chaba.org: "Each act of tikkun olam is a fine-tuning of our world's voices. With each tikkun, we are creating meaning out of confusion, harmony from noise, revealing the unique part each creation plays in a universal symphony that sings of its Creator."

This is a deeper meaning of the term *tikkun olam*: The word *olam* also means hidden. We need to repair the world so that its Creator is no longer hidden within, but shines through each thing in magnificent, harmonious beauty. While this is by no means a "Christian" concept, I believe the same can be said of each of us living our lives of faith.

Where have you seen an expression of *tikkun olam*? How have you seen small acts work towards repairing the world - are their small acts you can take today to help repair this broken world and restore God's creation? How do our words and actions play a part in the larger whole, the "symphony", that sings the praise and work of our Creator?

Pastor Kayla will be out of the office July 4-10th, July 14-15th, and August 10-15th.

Updates from Synod Assembly:

Delegates from Our Saviour's were Pastor Kayla, Britt Jacobsen, and Larry Gaarder. Susan Degner and Clara Kjelland attended as members of Synod Council. Both Susan and Clara will be serving another year on synod council, with Pastor Kayla being elected to serve on the synod's candidacy committee. We continue, as a conference, to lift up lay ministers and train them for ministry - with news being received that some funds have been giving to our conference to begin a new program.

A wonderful speaker from ELCA churchwide presented on stewardship and generosity - you will be hearing more about this in the coming months as we try to use some of his thoughtful materials and questions. The only resolution to come to the floor this year was updating the guidelines and compensation packages for rostered leaders. Next synod assembly is a bishop election year.
