

# Our Saviour's Lutheran Church Annual Meeting January 23, 2022

With a quorum present, the annual meeting of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church was called to order at 11:15 by Council Vice President Aaron Kjelland. Pastor Kayla Hill opened the meeting with prayer.

### Secretary's Report:

Patty Dahlen read the 2021 meeting minutes. Larry Gaarder/Lori Clemetson M/S/C to approve the 2021 meeting minutes.

### Treasurer's Report:

Dori Helgeson gave the 2021 treasurer's report. The total operating income was \$195,684.67 and the total operating expenses were \$170,565.82 leaving a net income of \$27,813. She thanked the congregation for their generous support and pointed out that \$76,260 of the income was from Simply Giving alone. Susan Degner/Barb Collins M/S/C to approve the 2021 Treasurer's Report.

#### Pastor's Report:

Pastor Kayla's report was printed in the annual report so she just highlighted a few items. She thanked the congregation for the support and help her family has received with the smooth transition to make Park River their home.

Committee reports were printed in the annual report.

#### **New Business:**

First reading of the changes and revisions to the Constitution and Bylaws. Highlighted items included:

- \*Reducing the number of council members from 12 to 9
- \*Combining Youth and Children's committees
- \*Cleaning up redundancy between the Constitution and Bylaws and taking out items from the model that had not been removed or a choice made.

Molly Flaten/Susan Degner M/S/C to approve the first reading.

### 2022 Proposed Budget:

The budget presented by Dori Helgeson includes total revenue of \$200,000 and total expenses of \$192,649. John Blair/ Susan Degner M/S/C to approve the budget for 2022.

### Council President's Report

2022 is in the books and 2023 has begun. The New Year is always time for reflection on the previous year and goal setting for the next year. Individually and sometimes collectively we evaluate how the year gone by went and make plans for change in the coming year. Our Saviour's goes through this process as well. We end December with the birth of Jesus and the excitement and energy that brings. We come out of the holiday season then arrive back at the beginning of the church business cycle. A new council is elected and new leaders chosen. A new budget full of changing priorities about how to use the church's monetary resources is passed. New members are chosen for committees who will do the work of the church. Each of these things allows us the opportunity to evaluate what we have done/are doing and potentially make changes and improve things. Here is a look back at the highlights of this past year as well as a preview of upcoming priorities.

I would like to start by thanking those who go above and beyond the ordinary participation of congregation members and work so hard to make our church function - Pastor Kayla, Linda, Dori, Sheryl, members of council, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, sound technicians, song leaders, ushers, speakers, welcomers, coffee leaders, those who serve on committees, WELCA, those who serve meals, those who work at funerals, and so many others I'm sure I'm forgetting. Each of these people and so many more go out of their way to provide opportunities for the congregation and make church happen each week. I am so thankful for each and every one of you who is willing to share your time and your gifts to make us stronger. If you have gifts that aren't currently being utilized please consider sharing them with us! Consider stepping outside of your comfort zone — serve on a committee, volunteer to teach Sunday school, or be a reader in church. Many hands make light work and we truly are better and stronger together!

The physical spaces of our church continue to be a focus of council. We are working on fixing some water damage in the balcony. We have completed multiple projects at the parsonage ranging from adding lights in the livings space to getting new flooring from sewer backup. Recently while doing roof repairs we also were informed that we are likely closer than expected to needing to address the roof of the church. Obviously any sort of construction is quite expensive. Balancing trying to update things and addressing issues that arise is a tough task. I am very thankful for those on buildings and grounds committee and the work that they do. Thank you!

Youth programming continues to be an emphasis. Sunday school has been reimagined to address staffing issues and the number of students we have. Confirmation has been revamped into a meaningful experience that is doing a wonderful job of teaching our kids about their faith and the church. Youth group got to go on an amazing service trip to Seattle this summer and continues to meet regularly. Again thank you to those of you giving your time and efforts to that. Continuing to focus on the next generation of our church is essential to our future and our present.

Finally, looking ahead to this coming year perhaps our biggest project will be trying to establish a food pantry in our church. The need for a food pantry was brought forward to all of the churches in our town. The consensus was many were interesting in helping but finding someone to commit to running it and providing the space was a big challenge so council voted to take on that project in our church. This is a massive undertaking in monetary resources, time, and manpower. It will take many committed individuals working together to make it happen and have a chance of it being successful but think about the extraordinary good it can do for those in need in our community. The opportunity to help others is well worth it but it will take significant resources to get it started and then perpetuate it. Those efforts have begun — we are working on preparing a space, donations are being collected, and a plan/procedures are being developed. If you value this effort and are willing to help in anyway (whether it be donating money or helping work) please let a member of council or the outreach committee know.

Undoubtedly as we enter a new year we will face unforeseen challenges, experience unpredicted joys, and have the opportunity to evaluate what we are and what we want to be as a church. I am so proud to be a member of our congregation and to have had the opportunity to help lead it this past year. I hope that we all – from council to pastor and staff to congregation – are able to further grow in our faith and work together to improve our church, our community, and the lives of not only those who worship with us but those who do not as well. Thank you again for another wonderful year and may God bless you and yours!

#### **BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS 2022**

Our Saviours Lutheran Church Buildings and Grounds is a committee in place to assist the congregation in facilitating the repair, maintenance, improvement, safety and aesthetics of our church properties and to help make our church an inspiring and welcoming place for everyone.

- \*This spring our parsonage home had sewer back up flooding into the basement. Many volunteers responded and removed the furniture and carpeting. The basement was sanitized and new carpet was installed. Sump pump hoses were extended away from the house. Gutters, downspouts and extensions were inspected.
- \*The wood fence along the south side of the parsonage property was repaired and painted.
- \* Leveled and placed a paver edging along the east side of the church landscaped bed.
- \* Tilled and reseeded new grass on the south lawn of the church as well as along the east side landscaped bed where needed.
- \*Our committee met for a safety walk though inspection of fire extinguishers and circuit breakers. Along with assessing other areas of need for our church.
- \*We have had continual need of repair on the church shingles, both entry and west roofs.
- \*Lawn care and snow removal for the side walks and parking lot have been arranged.
- \*A new condensation pump was needed for the church furnace.
- \*Church basement carpets have been cleaned with a plan to clean the entry, stairs and upstairs carpet in 2023.
- \*Approved by council for repair this year and into 2023 is the damage that was caused by a leaking roof and bell tower in the balcony several years ago.

There have been many small repairs and maintenance issues addressed throughout the year. In planning for the future, we work from a prioritized list of identified needs for our church properties. Please contact a committee member if you see something that needs our attention.

Thank you to everyone that has supported these improvements both prayerfully and financially. Thank you to all of you that do the work to keep our church home and property in good repair. We greatly appreciate the willingness of so many who give of their time and talent.

### Children's Ministry/Youth & Family Ministry

In 2022, 14 families registered their children for Sunday School. We have a total of 20 children Prek - 4th grade signed up to attend classes on Sunday mornings. We are conducting in person lessons as one large group. We study the same Bible story for three weeks, working through different activities to enhance and deepen understanding. The large group format allows for relationships to build between different ages, and makes it easier to find teachers each week. Once a month, the Sunday School kids join Coffee Hour for an activity and to share their learning and build relationships with members of the church. This summer, we partnered with Zion Lutheran Church to host a 3 day Vacation Bible School program. We had a great turnout and with help from church members, we were able to provide a sack lunch for each child to take with them. This winter, the students in Sunday School did a great job in leading worship through our Christmas Program on December 18. We continue to look for individuals who would like to lead lessons for Sunday School. It is a small commitment that offers fun, relationship building, and more time spent in worship.

### Youth Committee Report:

- Samantha Lee continued leading the youth group. - Connect, our group for middle school aged kids, continues to meet on Wednesday nights. They have averaged around 8 kids a night. It is one of two options for students of this level to participate in as they may also be in confirmation. Davis Thompson, Britt Jacobson, Jim Johnson, and Sara Freeman have been leading this group. They usually cover a devotional or lesson that takes around 30 minutes and ends with a fun activity.
